

AN AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE  
RELATING TO THE FORM OF ORDINANCES  
IN THE PROCEDURE FOR THE ADOPTION  
OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, the Scott Fiscal Court adopted on April 27, 1973, according to Krs 67.083, Ordinance No. 100-1 and known as "An Ordinance Relating to the Form of Ordinances and the Procedure for the Adoption of Ordinances."

WHEREAS, the purpose of said ordinance was to adopt a standard form for its ordinance and for the Fiscal Court of Scott County to adopt uniform procedures by which said ordinances are to become effective.

WHEREAS, Section 2, Procedure for enactment of Ordinances, does not fully set forth the procedure to be followed in adopting an ordinance; and the Scott Fiscal Court desiring to fully set forth the procedure to be followed in adopting an ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it ordained by the Fiscal Court of the County of Scott of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, that:

Section II of the Ordinance shall read as follows:

SECTION II

Procedure for Enactment of Ordinance

The regular enactment procedure for ordinances shall be as follows: Proposed ordinance shall be submitted to the Clerk of the Fiscal Court on the Monday preceding the regularly scheduled meeting of the Fiscal Court. Prior to placing any of the foregoing such actions on the schedule of the Fiscal Court, the Clerk shall have received a proved final draft from the legislative drafting section of the County Attorney's office. Upon receipt of the final draft, the Clerk shall be required to place on the schedule for consideration by the Fiscal Court all such ordinances.

Such ordinance shall be introduced by a member of the Fiscal Court for first reading at a regularly scheduled meeting of the

Scott County Fiscal Court.

No ordinance shall be passed at the meeting of the Fiscal Court at which it is introduced, nor shall it be passed at any succeeding meeting until it has been read or discussed in full at that meeting and free discussion allowed thereon.

There shall be published a complete compilation of the ordinances of the county which shall be known as the "Code of Scott County."
